The Art of Biblical Counseling (3 Credits):

This class is about how to help emotionally troubled people and designed to present what emotional illness is and how it may be treated successfully through “logo therapy”, with Christian fellowship and prayer. The Art of Biblical Counseling, by trained pastors, chaplains and lay persons in ministry is where many of our students find the Lord using them to help others in their ministry.

Dogmatics II -Man (3 Credits):
